Pastor's Corner

October is always Giving Emphasis month here at Longview Chapel. I have been blessed to work with multiple people on teams over the years who have created a meaningful generosity program for the congregation. It has been a gift to me to see the creativity, joy, and incredible hope for our future that these groups share in their work. This year's team is being co-led by Melanie Eubank and Pam Evans. Many thanks to them and to their team! They are coming up with some wonderful ideas to help us explore and celebrate generosity on October 12, 19 and 26, with our Commitment Sunday being on October 26.



Thinking about generosity in all of its forms brings back all kinds of memories to me of times when I have been able to give. Perhaps it does so for you as well. I think of when I was 15 and got my first real job at the original Fritz's in Kansas City, KS. I was a waitress, and frankly, I was not a great one. I have a lot of respect for those who wait tables efficiently and with graciousness. With that first job came a paycheck — my first! That was the first time I began to think about using money I had earned to give to church or to charities or to buy gifts for people using my money, not my parents'. I can also remember opening my first savings account.

Somehow making choices about how to spend money I had earned felt differently to me. I had both a greater sense of joy in giving it, and a better sense of how my earning and my giving were connected, not only to me but to others as well. One of the things I did was to give to our church. I'm sure my gifts did not add up to much. I helped a child in a third world country. I started saving for my college education. And yes, I spent part of the money on clothes, pizza, and some other fun things. My parents never really dictated what I had to do with money I earned. But I think their examples helped me to realize the importance of being generous and managing money well, rather than allowing money to manage me.

I can think of so many generous people I have met, so many of them here at Longview Chapel. They/you inspire me and I am grateful for your witness.

How is God leading us to be generous today and in the year ahead? Generous with our time, our talents and our resources?

"But who am I, and who are my people, that we should be able to give as generously as this?

SEPTEMBER BOARD MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

- The Board voted to authorize Treasurer Traci
 Holman to roll over a bank CD of \$56,262.07 for a
 5-month term if the interest rate is better than
 3.25%. It is set to mature October 23. Traci expects
 the interest rate will be 4%.
- The Board voted to reissue an outstanding check of \$360 (donation to Furry Kids Rescue) that was lost. It was decided not to place a stop payment to avoid the extra cost.
- The Board chair will be added to the church's bank account as a back-up check signer, the Board decided
- Repair work on the church building's north door entrance ramp will be funded at a cost of \$20,000 according to a proposal passed by the Board. Work will begin as soon as possible. The funds will come

from the Operating Fund money market, which currently stands at \$171,000.

- October's Board meeting was rescheduled by the Board from October 15 to October 22 due to the expected absence of some Board leaders.
- The Board approved a parental permission form to be used when a Longview Chapel staff member or volunteer is transporting children to a churchsponsored activity.

Only topics voted on are shared in the highlights. Complete minutes for September will be available after the October Board meeting.

The next Board meeting will be at 5:30 p.m. on Wednesday, October 22. Please note that this is on the FOURTH Wednesday of this month rather than the third.
